# 2023 California Cost of Child Care Survey

July 24, 2023

This survey is being conducted by a non-profit organization called <u>Prenatal to Five Fiscal Strategies</u> on behalf of the <u>California Department of Social Services (CDSS)</u> as part of the 2023 California Alternative Methodology Project. You may have participated in, or seen, a similar survey in 2022 that Prenatal to Five Fiscal Strategies conducted in California. The results of that survey (final report available <u>here</u>), helped to support the state in making the historic decision to use data on child care and preschool providers' costs to determine the amount that state pays for child care and preschool, rather than the price that families in each community can afford to pay (which rarely is enough to cover child care and/or preschool providers' expenses).

This second wave of data collection will build upon the 2022 survey (click <a href="here">here</a> if you would like to review the 2022 survey). If you participated in last year's survey, you have the option to have us use your data from last year (as long as we are able to match it to you/your program). Please note that if you did not provide enough information last year for us to locate your responses to the 2022 survey, you will be asked to complete a new survey.

The information you provide here will be combined with input from conversations with all types of child care and development services providers from all regions of the state and other key interest holders. The survey is part of an alternative methodology that the state will use to create a single structure of reimbursement rates. The state will submit necessary information to the federal government no later than July 1, 2024, to support use of a single rate structure utilizing the alternative methodology in the Child Care and Development Fund (CCDF) State Plan or an amendment to the State Plan.

The survey is for individuals, organizations and programs that provide child care and development services to children from birth through twelve years-old in the state of California. Because most of the survey questions ask about the costs you incurred between July 2022 and June 2023 in providing care to children, the best people to complete this survey are the following:

- An executive director, program director or financial director of a licensed (or license-exempt) child care center
- An owner of a licensed family child care home
- A family member, friend, or neighbor who provides care to their relatives and/or other children but who is not a licensed child care provider

For those who run a child care business, you may want to gather your expense statements and/or budget (if you have one) to help answer the questions (for example, it may be helpful to have your <u>Schedule C</u> IRS tax form nearby for reference). For those who are not licensed and provide care to family members, friends, and/or neighbors, we ask that you just do your best to estimate any costs you are asked to provide.

If you have more than one program/site, please complete a separate survey for each site. If you would prefer to share your data in the aggregate across multiple program/sites, please contact the P5FS study team to arrange an interview by emailing california@prenatal5fiscal.org or calling (217) 469-5250.

Please be assured that your information will be kept completely confidential and only the Prenatal to Five Fiscal Strategies project team will be able to see your individual responses. Your data will be combined with data from other child care and development programs and only the combined data will be shared in summary form and cannot be linked back to you or your program.
